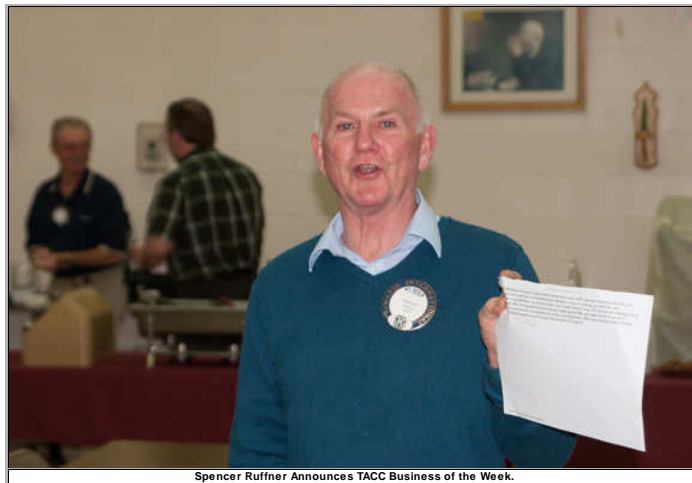
Doug Bird Asks for Park Cleanup Helpers.

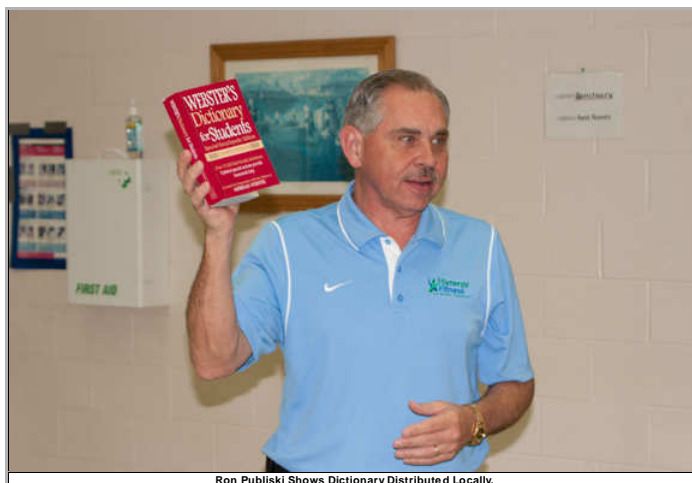
Cal Tuttle Needs Help with Flag Assembly.

John Deming introduced our speaker this morning Bonnie Bartlett, Girl Scouts Membership Specialist from Jackson. She is also a Brooklyn Kiwanian.

Bonnie talked about how Girl Scouts develop courage, confidence and character. She explained the organizational structure in Michigan and the local Tecumseh-Deerfield-Britton District. All Girl Scout activities are focused on the "15 Outcomes of the New Girl Scout Leadership Experiences." Activities give girls opportunities to make decisions about planning which leads to higher self esteem and enhanced leadership skills.

In Michigan, 19,000 girls are served by scouting, as well as 4,000 adults. There are 174 girl scouts in the local district. Camp-O-the-Hills at Wampers Lake was founded in 1926. The Jackson camp is used year round with strong emphasis on outdoor activities.

Our club's Youth Services Committee donated \$550 to the Girl Scouts to help with their efforts.
