• Program:

- **Kelly Coffin introduced Preschool Director Susan Dieter.**



Sue, the newly employed director starting in September, is in the process of relicensing the program which is housed at Sutton Elementary School.

Their program currently consists of 3 preschool classrooms:

Half day, tuition funded, morning or afternoon group, 5 days a week.

Full day, tuition funded, 4 days a week.

Great Start Readiness Program, grant funded, full day, 4 days a week

Before and After Care Program from 6:30 to 8 AM and 3:30 to 5:15 PM.

Their new programming this year includes all three groups participating in Excel classes with Sutton teachers for Art, Gym, Library and Music.

STAR rating established from assessment by outside group is 3 out of 5 stars currently and they are working to achieve a 5 out of 5 rating by June of 2015. To reach the star goal, 3 of the 6 staff members are taking classes to update their credentials. They have adopted a Creative Curriculum which aligns with the

school curriculum, Teaching Strategies GOLD and Brigance Assessment tools. And they are beginning Self Study, Step 1 towards NAEYC Accreditation (A national accreditation and they will be the only accredited preschool within a 26 mile radius. Goal for accreditation is Fall of 2016).

Future plans are to create an outdoor classroom in the existing playground and to have community Collaboration with Hidden Lake Gardens for preschool classes. Storybook trails and Outdoor Classroom.
