


Lana announces; Community Service committee disbursed 60



Program



Kurt Kominek, LISD and Amanda Brooks, ProMedica Bixby and Herrick Hospitals gave us an overview of a pilot project now in progress at Bixby Hospital. Project SEARCH is an international work-based learning program for students with developmental disabilities that imbeds itself into a business, hospital, or governmental agency. Students receive training as interns and are given the opportunity to work in 3 unpaid rotations throughout hospital departments during the September-July Project SEARCH calendar year. Kurt stated that the amount that a person with developmental disability collects during their live is approximately \$400,000.

Project SEARCH is partnership driven by ProMedica along with the LISD and several other partners to create job skills for eligible students 18 to 26 years old, with developmental disabilities.

There are currently 7 students in the program at ProMedica Bixby Hospital. These students currently work in 16 work sites located in Emergency Services, Environmental Services, Nursing Education, Central Supply, Medical Surgical, Respiratory Therapy, Obstetrics, Radiology, Employee Health, Human Resources, Maintenance and Nutritional Services at Bixby. Students must apply to be in the program, they are interviewed and

assessed before being admitted. Students must provide their own transportation to work. The skills they learn are real, transferable jobs, not just helping. The Students are evaluated for hygiene, social and communication skills.

Full time employment is the ultimate goal of these students. The goal of Project SEARCH is to provide opportunities for interns to increase their independent job task acquisition, to gain soft employability skills and to obtain employment. Each intern has a team of professionals from Goodwill Industries of Southeastern Michigan, Lenawee County Community Mental Health Authority, Michigan Rehabilitation Services and The Lenawee Intermediate School District in place to help them find employment. Worldwide, Project SEARCH has a job placement rate of 69%

The students have to adapt to the work site not the reverse. They must want to work. There is a tax incentive for businesses that hire Project Search students.
