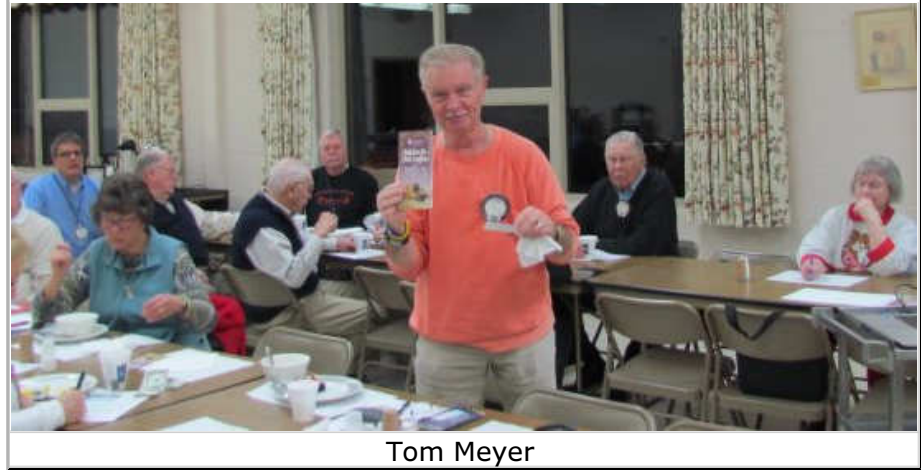
Anne Walker announced that Habitat is again having their pastie sale on January 30th. She will deliver if you buy.

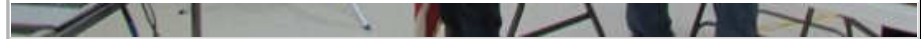

Doug Bird remarked about Gayle Hazelbaker's absence when the Morenci police chief was here and she disappeared today.



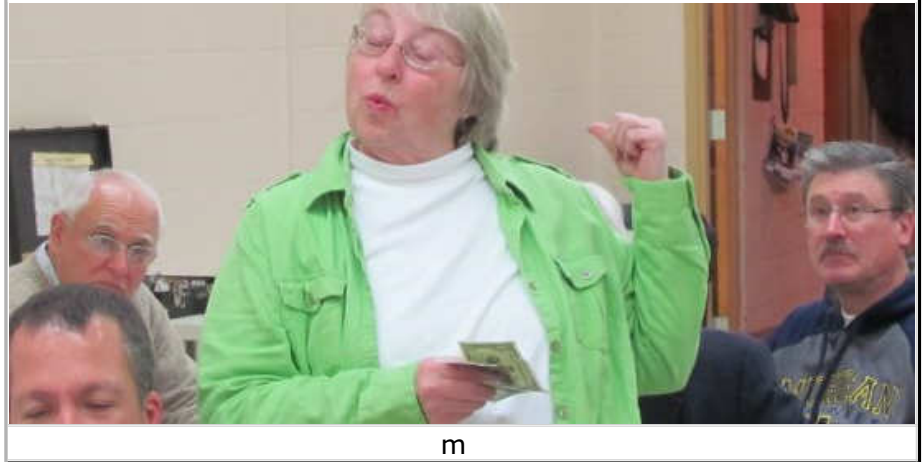

Kelly Higgins, Adult Transition Support Services with the LISD, a program

to assist adult students with disabilities.

There are 17 students, ages 18 to 26 in the program. The focus is to learn daily living skills, community living skills and adult skills. Daily living skills include house cleaning, cooking, kitchen safety, packing your own lunch 2 days a week. There are also introduced to shopping and money skills and healthy living skills where students work on being active and activities that help.

Volunteerism involves 31 partners and averages of 20 hours a week. Students assemble 1000 weekend snack packages a month, work at Fishes and Loaves, work with Housing Help of Lenawee doing mailings and painting, work at Habitat of Lenawee Restore, participate in the United Way day of action and have assisted at Associated Charities of Lenawee County assembling birthday packages and baby bundles.

The all student centered post high school program matches strengths to interests for jobs. Stressing volunteerism the program finds jobs in community that need to be done and kids practice real life skills with support before they go into the community. The program tries to increase their independence as per finances and healthy living and supports Lenawee students and families with transportation. This program has been in existence for 2 years and bridges the gap between school and real life.
