Megan Karpinski

Megan Karpinski, Supervisor of services for very young children (birth to 5 years) in Special Ed at LISD

Programs include

Lenawee's Child which is grant funded as well as by contributions, includes Great Start. Serves 228 children in 2014-2015. 180 kids served through 4 weeks of summer camps. They have a mobile classroom and set up outdoor classrooms too.

Early On, which provides a variety of therapies and family training. It is a statewide, year round, program for birth to 3 years. Children have developmental delay or health issues that will cause developmental delays. They have 130 kids on an on-going basis also 30-40 kids who receive additional support. Includes home visits, 2 days a week toddler group and is family friendly.

Early Childhood Special Ed Classrooms. There are 4 elementary classrooms. Helps to transition children into kindergarten. 123 pre-school students who need services in 2015-2016. There are 139 birth to 5 years olds in Tecumseh and 450 total students needing services.

Partners with child care programs and pre-schools. Every \$1 spent in early childhood saves \$7 later. 85% of their students maintained their skills in Kindergarten, first and second grade.
