Her job is working with kids in homeless situations so they can go to school. Being homeless, children may bounce around to different school systems. In 2001 there was a law change so that kids in temporary situations can stay in their "home" school and the homeless coordinator and the schools need to work out transportation so that can happen. She works to continue the kids education in one school system no matter where they are living.

She also assists with clothing help. Currently Old National Bank has a "Tools for Schools" collection. The bank is collecting pencils, pens, markers, paper and any type of school supply which will then be donated to the Homeless program.

Sometimes kids feel lost, like there is no one that cares. Beth works with families that will take in a homeless child through Catholic Charities with a program call "Road Map to Graduation". This program is similar to foster care and has no legal issues, home visits similar to the foster system are conducted monthly and through the Charities kids get therapy for an entire year. If communities pull together, they can create miracles.

There were over 700 homeless kids in the county each of the last 5 years. In Tecumseh there are usually between 40-60 kids.

In the Adrian Public School Systems there is an organization that buys shoes for the children in need. There is no such program in Tecumseh and there is always a need for shoes in the Tecumseh system.

Beth uses as many existing programs to help homeless kids.
