Brian Calahagn introduced Tecumseh Chief of Police Troy Stern





Chief of Tecumsh Police Department Troy Stern, a local lad, presented information on the Tecumseh Police Department. Graduated from Clinton in 1989 and started with the Tecumseh Police in 1994. He became a sergeant in 2002 and the Chief in 2010. He has 4 kids aged 17 to 3.

In 1964 there were 12 officers, including the Chief, currently there are 13 officers including the Chief. The population has doubled during that time. All current officers are over the age of 30. Tecumseh officers have had body cameras for over 2 years. Must be 21 years old and attend a 21 week academy.

Busiest day is Thursday, next busiest is Friday.

Greatest concern is the 911 surcharge coming up in May. Much needed to replace outdated equipment that it is difficult or impossible to repair. With regards to children his greatest concern is abuse and drug use particularly Medical Marijuana which is a gateway drug. Heroin use is ravaging our young people.

There are not a lot of robberies per year, most are at businesses. Auto break-ins are higher, mostly of unlocked cars. These break-ins run in streaks.

There is no police school liason in Tecumseh.

Police department received old cell phones which are repaired and given to seniors and lower income residents. The phones do not have minutes but can be used to call 911. They also have a drug drop box in their lobby. Pills must be in original bottles, no liquid, needles or inhalers. The drugs are incinerated, they do not end up in the water systems and do not affect the environment. So far they have destroyed over 1200 pounds of drugs.
