His education came from the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Born January 23, 1940 and delivered by Dr. Helzerman, he was the 800th patient at the “new” Herrick Hospital. His father had a business here in the building now the Doll House and Jerry learned to wash windows working for his dad. He attended a one room church school on Ives Road through the 8th grade and then attend an academy in Holly, MI for grades 9-12. He came home every 6 weeks during school. He met his wife, Marilyn, while attend the academy. He attended Andrews University in Berrien Spring for 3 years and was accepted to dental school at Loma Linda University. During his 4 years at the university he experienced 3 earthquakes. He was married June 19, 1960 and will celebrate 57 years next week. He practiced in Decatur MI for a short time and then came to Tecumseh and joined the Murray and Laidlaw practice. He developed a very close relationship with Dr. Murray. After coming here he met Dr. Cook who asked him when he was going to get rid of his 1964 Mercury which had been damaged in Santa Anna sand storms. Jerry went to see Keith Bailey and took home a convertible he wanted to purchase. He wife said NO her kids were not riding in a convertible so he bought something else. He loved his dental practice and loves Kiwanis which he joined in 1972. He was our President the 1975-1976 year. Todd Amstutz, City of Tecumseh Superintendent of Utilities Department

Has been with the City for 28 years working his way up to his current position.

Distributed an informational pamphlet regarding the City drinking water and lead.

In 1997-1998 most of the lead pipes were removed from the City system. During the 1990 Streetscape project, pipes were changed to copper. If waterlines are galvanized they could have lead joints. Older homes should flush their water for 30 seconds. There are no lead pipes or fittings in the city watermains. There are 7 water wells serving the city. Water is sampled every 3 years. In 2014 of 20 residents tested only 4 detected lead and they were all below the limit. The water

from the city is SAFE. The new rule for water testing is on the first flush from the pipe. The next sampling will be in 2017 with 20 homes being tested. Tecumseh water is high in iron and is 100% ground water. Each well is tested yearly. Polyphosphate added to water coats pipes. There are 44 miles of sewer main in the city. In 1992-1993 a wooden water pipe was found in the city, it was not being used.
