Old National Bank, Cambrian Assisted Living and Tecumseh Big Boy.

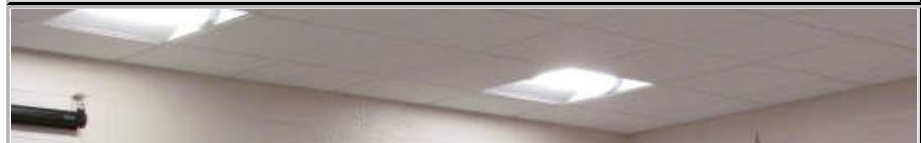


Lana Archer – Community Service Committee meeting next Tuesday, June 21, following regular meeting.
