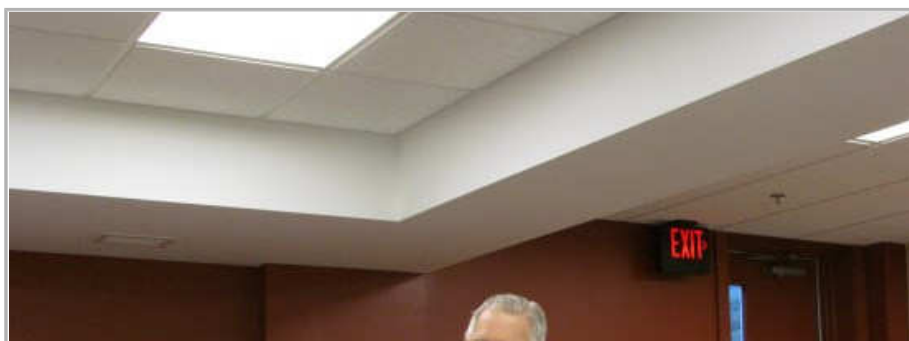

Anne Keller, Teen Services at Tecumseh District Library where she has worked for 10 years.

Anne provided us with information about "Zinio" a new magazine on-line program exclusive to TDL. TDL card holders do not have to be on a waiting list for magazines. They may download and keep them as long as they like. There are no subscription fees and all magazines are in one place.

Over 250 magazine titles are available. Apps can be downloaded. Perks include: many magazines, like Consumer Reports, have several previous editions available and you can be notified by email when magazines are available. You can create your own list of favorites. Current magazines cannot be checked out from the library but you can get them through Zinio. There are no ramifications or fines.

They also have available America's News Database where many newspapers are available on line. Local papers available include the Telegram, The Blade and Ann Arbor News. There are also news magazines available.

Another available tool on their website is Mango a conversational interactive language learning program. The web address is www.tecumsehlibrary.org.
