Lenawee Cares will provide services for Lenawee and Only Lenawee County residents. Lenawee Cares. For Lenawee. For good. For ever.

After much discussion the Lenawee United Way asked the Lenawee Community Foundation to take responsibility for the annual campaign to serve local people in need. The new name is Lenawee Cares. The sole beneficiary will be Lenawee County.

United Way doesn't match our mission for Lenawee County. Overhead for United Way is 40% and the office is now closed. Currently United Way doesn't allow for designated specific fund donations.

With Lenawee Cares you will be able to designate and 100% of the moneys raised will stay in Lenawee County. If you work outside Lenawee, designate your donations to Lenawee Cares. Health, human services and basic needs will be met with Lenawee Cares. Overhead will be reduced and money will not go to a national organization. 10% of monies raised will go into Lenawee kCares Health and Human Services Endowment. Endowment earned funds are used for grants.

The 211 system is not accurate and not local. Currently 211 calls cost about \$13 each to process. Lenawee residents may call Lenawee Community Foundation 423-1729 or go to their website www.lenaweecf.com and receive the information they need from local people.

Monroe United Way is being competitive, unions are upset and protesting the change. Lenawee Cares did their part in reaching out.
