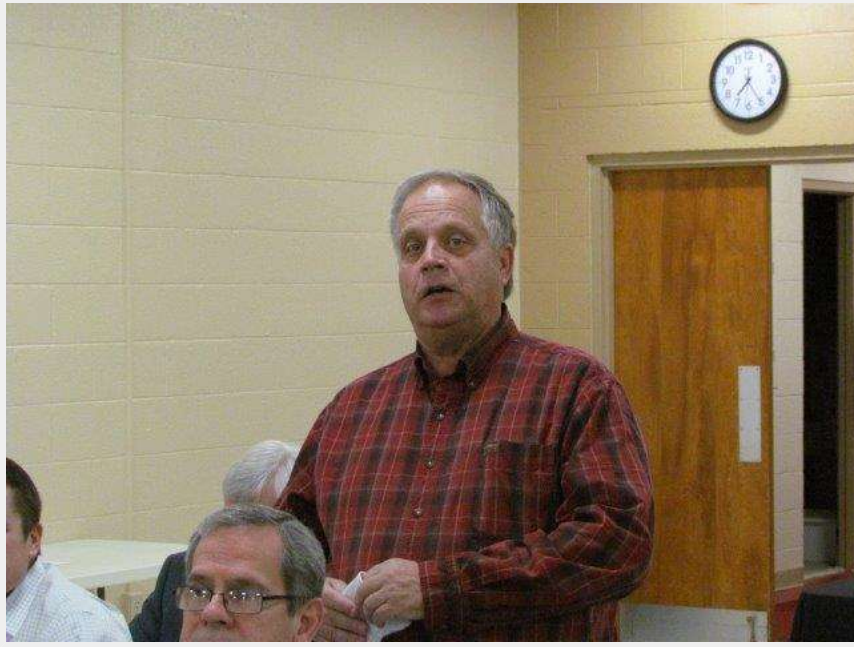

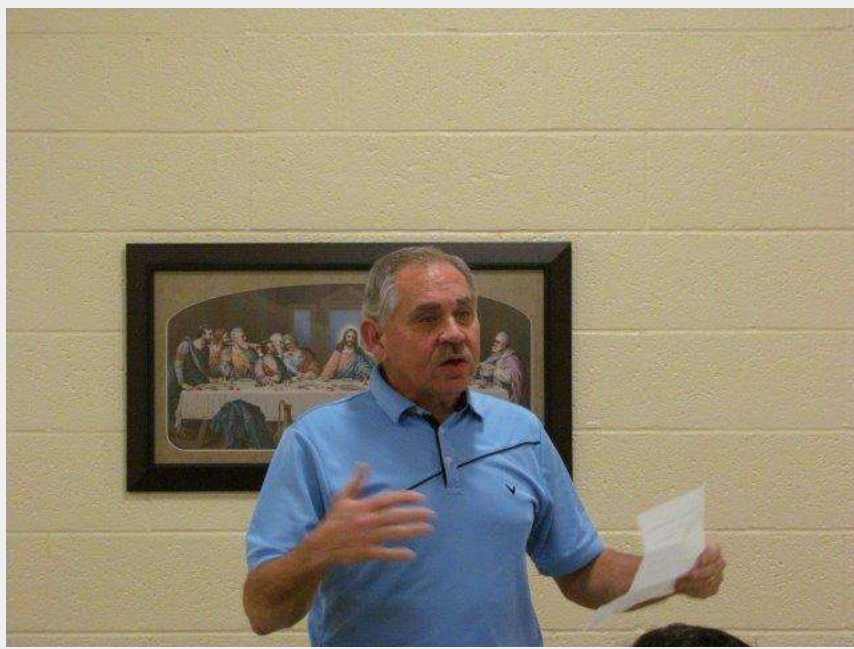
Bill Baker - John Bartram is in Toledo Hospital, has had brain surgery and is progressing well.

Ron Publiski - Kiwanis purchased the computer used for the "greenscreen" project which was the feature of the program last week.



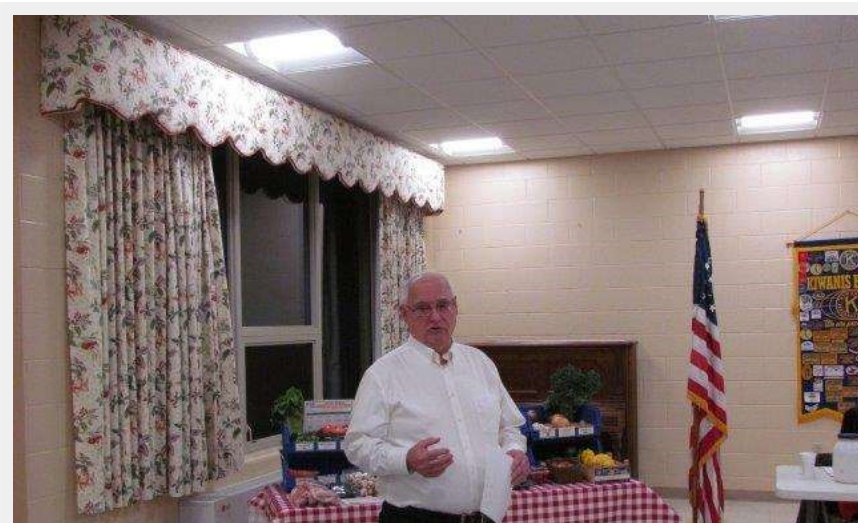

There are 35 words in the oath, was "In God We Trust" in the original oath? Answer: No, In 1789 George Washington added it and all presidents since have used it.

The 20th Amendment established January 20th as Inauguration Day.

If it falls on Sunday, there is a small official ceremony which is then followed on Monday by a public inauguration.

The Constitution allows a president to "swear" or "affirm". Only 2 Presidents have chosen to affirm, Franklin Pierce and Herbert Hoover.

All Presidents, except Teddy Roosevelt, were sworn in on a bible. He used a book containing the Constitution.

T. Roosevelt carried a lock of Lincoln's hair.

The first Inauguration Ball was held in 1809 for President Madison.

Program





ProMedica Veggie Mobile - Jared Claar and Stacey Tilton were presenters.

The Veggie Mobile is modeled after a program in Grand Rapids. It is a truck that circulates in Lenawee County providing fresh fruits and vegetables available for purchase.

Items are available for purchase by anyone. A USDA 3 year grant was awarded and funds were used to buy the truck. The truck is used to serve the entire Lenawee County area. Bixby/ProMedica was the main awardee.

It has been in service for 3 years and is now a project of ProMedica Bixby Hospital in partnership with Lenawee Health Network (LHN).

The Veggie Mobile is used to make available fresh fruits and vegetables. Some herbs are also available for purchase.

Purchase prices are in quarter increments to make it easier and less change. The truck visits all senior centers in Lenawee County and various other locations.

Anyone can purchase from the Veggie Mobile and either cash or bridge cards are accepted.

Items may be purchased individually or in small amounts. Most items are grown locally or purchased through Celino's in Temperance.

The truck runs 12 months a year.

The Mobile is a perfect bridge between the hospital and the community.

Education is part of the program. Recipes are provided for some of the items for sale.

Through the Veggie Mobile a piece of fresh fruit is provided for 105 students receiving "Friday Foodpacks" through the Tecumseh School system.

Any items donated to the program are then given from the truck for free.

Items not sold are donated to the Clinton Food Pantry, Fishes and Loaves in Adrian, St. Mary's Food Pantry or God's Breadbasket in Tecumseh.

There is a facebook page, "ProMedica Veggie Mobile" and it contains the monthly schedule.

During 2016 the truck operated for 9 months and served over 4,100 patrons. January Veggie Mobile Schedule:
